



2010 Vintage Veggie Information

ARTICHOKE GREEN GLOBE	This artichoke is great for cool, short season climates. Prepare your harvest steamed and it is also very tasty boiled with a splash of olive oil and garlic. Space 2' - 3' apart in the sunniest location in your garden that has rich, well drained soil. A California classic !
BEAN BLUE LAKE POLE	This is a tasty and tender bean. Very dependable and easy to grow. Plant 2'-3' apart in a sunny location. Support with string or trellis.
BEAN BUSH BLUE LAKE	Bush variety. Bean is long and smooth with a sweet and delicate flavor. Great producer over a long season in sunny locations.
BEAN GOLDEN WAX	Totally string less and no staking. This is the low maintenance bean with a high yield. Beans are a golden yellow even when cooked! Quite tender and juicy, perfect fresh or canned.
BEAN GREEN & GOLD MIX	55 Days. This is a blend of two types of bush-type beans. Golden wax bean, (wax refers to the color yellow) and a bush green bean. Both of which are early to harvest and tasty.
BEAN KENTUCKY WONDER POLE	67 days. One of the oldest and most widely used varieties. Bright green 8 inch pods are vey flavorful. Resistant to rust. Climbs freely, produces quickly and bears until frost.
BEAN ROYALTY PURPLE POD	55-60 Days. This heirloom bush bean was bred at the University of New Hampshire. It produces, 5" long purple stringless beans which turn green when they are cooked. Adds beautiful color to a salad or vegetable tray when served raw.
BEET BULLS BLOOD	Heirloom. 58 Days. Deep burgundy leaves for salad mix. Roots show attractive candy stripe zoning when sliced.
BEET CHIOGGA	Heirloom. 50 Days. Brought to us by Italy in the late 1840's. It's flesh has beautiful red and white rings that resemble a bulls-eye. Colorful rings remain when cooked, if cooked whole and sliced just before serving. Excellent roasted or pickled.
BEET DETROIT DARK RED	60 days. This beet has unbeatable canning and pickling quality. Robust sweet flavor with intense bright crimson color with no white streaks or rings. Tops are rich in vitamins A and C.
BROCCOLI DICICCIO	This Italian heirloom produces very good quality 3-4" heads with lots of side shoots. A very good cool season variety.
BROCCOLI PURPLE SPROUTING	120 Days. Cool Weather. This broccoli has a deep purple color, minus the big, full head. This variety has smaller heads that sprout out throughout the plant. Once the main, largest head is harvested, side sprouts begin to grow throughout the season. Purple turns to green after cooking. Entire plant is edible.
BROCCOLI ROMANESCO	Heirloom. 120 Days. The best tasting broccoli hands down. This variety is a prized heirloom from Italy. The whirling, light green heads are delightful as well as their flavor and texture. Grows best in cooler climates.
BRUSSEL SPROUT CATSKILL	Give these tasty nuggets a little space in your garden and find out how delicious they are! This selection is a semi-dwarf variety that grows 20"-24" tall. It is very flavorful and will produce a generous crop. Does best in rich well drained soil. Cool season crop.
CABBAGE COPENHAGEN MARKET	Heirloom. 100 days. One of the largest early varieties. Solid round heads 6-8" across weigh 3-4 lbs. Good keeper.
CABBAGE MAMMOTH RED ROCK	Heirloom. 98 days. Introduced in 1889. Solid round heads are 8" in diameter and weigh 7 pounds. Red throughout, small to medium core. Excellent for cooking, salads, and pickling.
CABBAGE SAVOY PERFECTION	90 days. Savoyed leaves are sweet and mild with crinkled texture. When grown as a late crop, flavor improves after light frost. Great raw in coleslaw, or can be steamed, stir fried, or made into sauerkraut.
CAULIFLOWER PURPLE CAPE	Heirloom. 200-240 Days. Brought to us from South Africa in 1808, this vegetable is full of antioxidants and has a beautiful purple head. Needs less cooking than white headed types. Purple varieties are said to be better for us than white headed cauliflowers. Loses its bright purpleness if cooked too long.
CAULIFLOWER SELF BLANCH	71 days. A cool season vegetable. 7 inch heads with excellent leaf protection. Does not need tying especially in fall crops.
CELERY TALL UTAH	A temperate climate celery. Stalks will get 11-12" long. They are dark green and very crisp. Have you ever tried home grown celery? You should give it a try!

COLLARDS GEORGIA	If you can't swallow a vitamin try eating collards instead. Collards are loaded with vitamin A, B1, B2, and C. The leaves of this collard are dark green and it is best to pick when the leaves are young. This is a non-heading variety so the more you pick the more it will grow. Can take some frost and will tolerate heat.
CORN BLOODY BUTCHER	Heirloom. 105 Days. Large 10-12" blood-red ears grow on 9'-12" stalks. Plants produce 1-2 ears per plant. Plants need to be planted in multiples to pollinate. Used for flour, corn on the cob when young, and decorations in fall. Grown in the US since 1845.
CORN HONEY AND PEARL	AAS Winner. 76 days. Early maturing bicolor super sweet hybrid. Nine inch ears have tight wrapping which reduces corn ear worm infestations. Super sweet corn is bred to contain twice the sugar of regular sweet corn and they retain their sweetness up to 2 weeks longer.
CORN JUBILEE	81 days. Glossy yellow kernels with high sugar content and smooth texture. 8 1/2 inch long ears with 16-20 rows.
CORN PEACHES AND CREAM	83 Days. One of the tastiest bicolored sweet corns on the market. Yellow and creamy white colored kernels wrap around its 8 inch cobs in 14 delicious rows. Excellent grilled on the barbecue in their own husks. Plant many plants to ensure pollination.
CORN SILVER PRINCESS	Extra early variety, be the first with corn ready this summer. This is a super sugary sweet white corn with bright luminescent kernels. Yummy and early...you can't beat that!! 2 1/2 weeks earlier than the old standard Silver Queen. Great disease tolerance for better yields.
CORN STRAWBERRY (POPCORN)	Heirloom. 105 Days. Small 2-3" strawberry-shaped ears grow on these 4-6' stalks, yielding about 3-4 ears per stalk. Beautiful mahogany-red kernels make this a variety used as decoration or may be popped as popcorn. Popcorn is white when popped. Plant many, in at least 3 rows for pollination.
CUCUMBER ARMENIAN	These light green delicacies have a delicious clean, fresh taste and are burp less. The unusual fruits will be slightly ribbed and spineless when mature. Pick them for best flavor when they are 12 - 15 inches long, but they can reach up to 24 inches in length. Growing the plants up a trellis will reward you with straighter fruit for easier slicing. Plant in your garden area that has moist well drained soil and receives full sun.
CUCUMBER HOMEMADE PICKLES	This special cucumber has been bred for making the best pickles you've ever tasted! Harvest when they are 1-1/2 inches long for tiny sweets or 5 to 6 inches long for robust dills and spears. They are solid and crisp with superb flavor. Vigorous 5 foot long vines exhibit excellent disease resistance and will give you armloads of fruit. See you at the county fair!
CUCUMBER JAPANESE SUYO	A wonderful long and curvy dark green fruit with non bitter burp less skin. Grow in warm sunny location.
CUCUMBER LEMON	This scrumptious old fashioned yellow cucumber has the nicest sweet, mild flavor. It's attractive bright lemon-yellow round fruit should be picked when they are 2 to 3 inches in diameter. This variety is a favorite of cool season gardeners. It grows into a nice 3 to 4 foot tall semi-bush form that does best with moist well drained soil. Kids will love to grow and eat this pretty little cucumber!
CUCUMBER MARKETMORE SLICING	Great slicing cucumber with dark green skin. Easy to grow and disease resistant. Plant in sun 2-'3' apart.
CUCUMBER TENDERGREEN BURPLESS	Great non bitter, burp less variety. Sweetest flavor when fruit is picked at 5". Plants are resistant to mildew.
EGGPLANT BLACK BEAUTY	Still THE classic home gardener's favorite eggplant. Each plant will give you as many as five enormous fruits. The eggplant skin is a rich glossy blackish purple and the interior is very tender and has great flavor. Remember to plant several for all of your favorite Mediterranean recipes. Position these young plants in full sun and make sure to give them well composted soil.
EGGPLANT FAIRYTALE	Plump and tender this is a great eggplant with a nice creamy flavor. The skin is a pretty purple and white marble. These plants are small only 18-24" and can be very prolific. Pick eggplant when they are 4-5" long. A super veggie for a small garden area.
EGGPLANT JAPANESE MILLIONAIRE	Japanese Millionaire is the most popular selection that you will find in local Asian markets. This plant will give you slender 8"-12" long deep purple fruit that are very tender and have a mild flavor and are never bitter. Try them in your cooking or pickling.
EGGPLANT LAVENDER TOUCH	Very pretty white cylindrical fruit with a lavender blush, and a mild flavor. Very productive plant. Heat loving vegetable.
EGGPLANT LISTADA DE GANDIA	This beautiful heirloom eggplant came to us from France. The egg-shaped, 5-6" fruits are purple with irregular, mosaic, cream colored striping. Its thin skin doesn't need to be peeled before eating. Thrives in hot climates with little water.
EGGPLANT PINGTUNG LONG	Named after a town in Thailand this heat tolerant plant bears 18" long fruits. The plant is covered with these long, lavender-purple eggplants in the summer. Flesh is white and mild in flavor. Excellent in many Thai dishes.
EGGPLANT ROSA BIANCA	Heirloom. 65 Days. This gorgeous heirloom eggplant is very popular in Italy's farmers markets. The 4-5" round and slightly ribbed fruits have a painted pinkish-purple striping on a pale off white background.
EGGPLANT THAI GREEN	Heirloom. 80 Days. An eggplant used extensively in Thai cuisine, this long 12", light green beauty is tender and absorbs any flavors you incorporate. Due to its thin and tender skins, no need to peel. Extremely prolific and drought tolerant plants.

ENDIVE SALAD KING	95 days. Long curled and deeply cut leaves with dark green blade and pale green midrib. More spreading and very slow bolting in hot weather. Also withstands fall rains and light frost.
KOHLRABI PURPLE VIENNA	Heirloom. 55 Days. This unusual looking veggie is related to the turnip, aka; German Turnip. The fruit gets 3 inches and a rose-purple color when ripe. Kohlrabi's flavor has been described as a mild turnip, broccoli stems, mild radish and cucumber flavor. Fabulous fresh, in salads, or steamed.
LEEK AMERICAN FLAG	130 Days. These leeks are relatively compact, the bulb is about 1 1/2" round and about 8-10" in height. Usually harvested in the fall, but overwinter well and can make it to spring. Mild onion flavor, bulb never gets thick. Tender creamy yellow centers used for grilling fresh or chopped into soups. Bulb is blanched from the base upward.
LETTUCE SLOBOLT	48 Days. Batavia-type. This loose leaf type lettuce holds well in the summer months. Light green fringed leaves grow on a compact heavy based plant. Extremely slow to bolt and doesn't turn bitter even when it does. Good for warmer climates as well as temperate climates.
LETTUCE BISTRO SALAD GOURMET BLEND	55 Days. This looseleaf type lettuce holds well in the summer months. A mix of light green and red, fringed and smooth leaved varieties. Excellent for salads, sandwiches, garnish and any herbivore in your house.
LETTUCE BLACK SEEDED SIMPSON	An heirloom variety that is still one of the best producing around. The earliest tender leaf lettuce that is good for spring or fall plantings. It quickly produces a large head of crinkly, juicy, light green leaves. Harvest leaves often for a longer salad production season.
LETTUCE BUTTERCRUNCH	50-60 Days. Bibb or Butterhead-type. Much like other bibb type lettuces, but Buttercrunch has a tight compact head with thick, juicy green leaves. Maintains its sweetness during the summer months, and holds into the fall without bolting.
LETTUCE FRECKLES	Heirloom 50-60 Days. Romain or Cos-type. This tasty Romaine lettuce is light green with dark red/brown speckles throughout its elongated leaves. Holds well in the heat, unlike many Romaines. aka Forellenschluss, meaning "trout's back". Great for Ceasar's salads.
LETTUCE GOURMET SALAD BLEND	A special blend of our favorite lettuces in equal proportions for the easiest salad producing garden that you could wish for !
LETTUCE GREEN OAKLEAF	Heirloom. 50 Days. Known in the 1880's as Baltimore or Philadelphia Oakleaf. This oak-shaped, green lettuce produces mild tasting leafy greens all season long. It's known to hold well in hotter climates.
LETTUCE LOLLA ROSSA DARK	Heirloom. 50 Days. This slow growing, lettuce has a compact head, burgundy-red colored frilled leaves, with green centers and a mild flavor. Harvest the outside leaves and they keep coming. Excellent baby lettuce.
LETTUCE OUTREDEGEIOUS	A totally bright red romaine lettuce ! This outstanding variety shows it's solid brilliant red color even with some shade. The leaves are thick, crisp and juicy with sweetness unmatched by other lettuce types. The baby leaves are long with ruffled edges and the mature heads are big, tall, and beautiful with a loose character. Try this fabulous new lettuce in your salad garden !
LETTUCE RED ICEBERG	70-80 Days. This medium to large Iceberg lettuce is as gorgeous as many loose leaved varieties. Nice mild flavor. Fairly tight heads hold well, without bolting. Exceptionally colorful for an Iceberg variety.
LETTUCE RED ROMAINE	Medium sized, deep burgundy leaves adorn this romaine lettuce. Harvest early for pretty, crisp, young red leaves that have a sweet flavor, or let the plants mature into the classic romaine head that is easy to pick and use in salads. Pair with green romaine varieties for a beautiful combination in your garden.
LETTUCE RED SAILS	Red Sails is an AAS award winner and it is an all time favorite ! This loose leaf variety will measure up to 10 inches across and it's medium green, broad leaves are deeply fringed and pleasantly crinkled. The edges of these lettuce leaves have a beautiful burgundy blush that holds in the garden for an extended period after maturity without getting bitter. A heat resistant variety you will surely love.
LETTUCE RED VELVET	Heirloom. 55 Days. Loose leaf-type. This slow-bolting lettuce has deep, dark red-maroon leaves that get 6-8" tall and the heads get 10-12" wide. Extremely deep in color, one of the darkest reds in production. Beautiful for garnish on a plate, or an excellent addition to any gourmet salad!
LETTUCE ROMAINE	Cos-type. 55 Days. An easy to grow garden favorite that has a crisp sweet flavor. This plant will form a loose head with long, dark green 8 to 9 inch leaves. Harvest young leaves as needed for salads or let the plants mature into it's familiar shape. Good heat tolerance.
LETTUCE ROUGE DE HIVER HEIRLOOM	This French heirloom variety name means "Winter Red". A Romaine type lettuce which is popular used when it's leaves are baby sized and will continue to produce for a long season. It is sweet and very attractive. The leaf color varies from green to bronze-red. An elegant addition to your salad bed.
LETTUCE SALAD BOWL RED	Red Salad Bowl is highly regarded for use when it's leaves are baby sized. Radiant burgundy-red, deeply lobed, delicate oak like leaves form a full rosette. It is an early producer and holds its mild flavor for an extended period. This variety grows well in spring, summer and fall.
MELON BANANA	80- 100 days. Heirloom. Introduced in 1888. An unusual smooth creamy yellow skinned melon that is 18 inches long. Flesh is soft and juicy salmon orange color with a strongly sweet flavor like an over ripe banana.

MELON CANOE CREEK COLOSSAL	Heirloom. 90 Days. These beautiful orange and green, football shaped melons are prolific and large if watered well. The size can get from 8-20 pounds, depending on water availability. Several produced on each vine.
MELON CRENSHAW	This melon has yellow gold skin with pale salmon colored flesh. Extra sweet and juicy with a slight spicy smell. Does best in hot well drained location.
MELON DELICE DE LA TABLE	Heirloom. 85 Days. Translates to; "Delight of the Table", this very rare French heirloom melon is approximately 1-2 pounds each. A yellow/orange, ribbed rind, with flesh that's orange and sweet. Resembles a small pumpkin. Around since 1885.
MELON EARLY SILVER LINE	Unique, elongated oriental melon. White, crisp flesh sweet and fragrant. A small delicious gourmet melon rarely found in markets. Yellow skin lined with silvery furrows, so thin it can be peeled like an apple. Harvest 76 days after sowing.
MELON EMERALD GEM	Heirloom. 80 Days. Pale orange, rich juicy fleshed melon, with a dark green rind with crackling striping. Fruit is small softball sized, sweet and luscious. Plant produces high yields. Heirloom introduced by W.Atlea Burpee in 1886 from seed sent from William Voorhees of Benzie County, Michigan.
MELON GREEN NUTMEG	83 days. Heirloom. The fruit is large and round, netted with flattened ends, deeply ribbed with a thin ring. Flesh is light green with a spicy flavor that reminds you of nutmeg.
MELON HALES BEST JUMBO	Heirloom variety. Skin is tan with netting, and flesh is bright orange. Rich aromatic flavor. Plants do best in hot and well drained locations.
MELON HEARTS OF GOLD	An almost round 3 -4 pound fruit with an aromatic, sweet scent. Thick deep orange flesh with a small seed cavity. Ripens early.
MELON HONEYDEW GREEN FLESH	Skin is lime green with yellow accents when ripe. Flesh is light green, watery and very sweet. Does best in hot dry locations.
MELON HONEYDEW ORANGE FLESH	Flesh looks like cantaloupe but has a honeydew skin. Flesh is sweet with honeydew flavor. Prefers hot well drained location.
MELON MINNESOTA MIDGET	Cute little miniature 4" melons resemble cantaloupe but the mini version. Great tangy sweet traditional cantaloupe taste. Vines are smaller too...and will only grow 3-4 feet. The perfect melon for small garden areas.
MELON QUEEN ANNE'S POCKET	Heirloom. 80-90 Days. These spherical small fruits grow 3-4" and have a smooth skin decorated with orange and yellow striping. The white flesh is extremely fragrant and used in the Victorian days, for its perfume qualities.
MELON TIGGER	This is a beautiful melon. It is fire red with yellow stripes. Very bright and distinctive, but also very tasty. The flesh is white and very sweet. Great melon for hot areas.
MIZUNA	These elegant dark green leaves have neat saw-toothed edges and a mild yet tangy flavor. Very good in a salad. Can be grown in veggie beds or herb gardens.
MIZUNA RED STREAK	Heirloom. 80-85 Days. Mustard Leaf. Ornately fringed purple and green leaves with a mild, peppery-mustard flavor. Used in many micro-green or baby lettuce mixes. Best color when it is young, and grown in cool climates.
MUSTARD RED GIANT	Spicy flavored greens that can be used like spinach. Coppery colored leaves make it a very colorful addition to a salad. Very unique flavor and color. They usually have a very long growing season...remember the more you pick the more it will produce!
OKRA CAJUN DELIGHT	Super prolific plants producing tons of 5" long fruit. Plants grow to 38", and are very adaptive to a wide range of growing climates. This is a tasty okra and a true staple of Cajun cooking.
ONION BORETTANA YELLOW	Heirloom. 60 Days. Italian heirloom traditionally pickled, if harvested when small, its 2" wide and 1" thick. May be used as fresh in summer, and gets as big as 3-4" in diameter. Skin turns bronze-yellow and flesh is firm and sweet. Great on kabobs for the bar be que. aka Capollini.
ONION LISBON GREEN BUNCHING	Grow your own green onions for salads, garnishes or as an addition to the appetizer tray.
ONION LONG RED FLORENCE	Heirloom. 100-120 Days. This Italian heirloom is a rare and hard to find treasure. Its long and bottle-necked shaped. Mild flavor and a nice purple glossy exterior. Use fresh in spring and fall in mild climates.
ONION RED CREOLE	Heirloom. 90-110 Days. This small onion has a deep red color. Its taste is sweet and its aroma is pungent. Short day length variety. Excellent for sandwiches and salads
ONION RED (BURGUNDY)	100 days. Short day variety suitable for southern regions. Produces 4" wide red onions with a mild sweet flavor. Excellent slicing variety.
ONION WHITE SPANISH	Well known mid-season onion. Mild sweet flavor raw, also great sautéed or deep fried. One of the best all-round white onions available. Produces large bulbs with fair storage qualities. Short to intermediate day.
ONION YELLOW SPANISH	Large yellow globe-shaped bulbs with mild flavored creamy white flesh. Allow the thick necks to dry well before harvesting. Short to intermediate day.
PAK CHOI WHITE STEM	45 days. A nonheading leaf type Chinese cabbage that produces large 8-10" long nearly round, smooth glossy green leaves with a snow white stalk. Very cold hardy and produces over a long period of time. Crisp and mild tasting. Great for Oriental cooking.

PEA AMISH SNAP	Heirloom. 60 Days. This luscious, 2 pea pod has a sweet, plump flesh that produces on 6 foot vines for 6 continuous weeks, as long as its kept picked. Popular in the Amish communities way before now.
PEA GREEN ARROW	Very high yielding plants. A sweet garden pea that is tender and about 4" long. Peas grow in pairs at the top of the plant for very easy picking. Plants are resistant to disease. Great cool season veggie.
PEA SNOW OREGON SUGAR POD	If you have a small area for a garden this is the perfect snow pea for you! The vines are small only reaching 24-30" and don't need any staking. They have a delicious sweet taste, and good crisp texture. They are stringless too! Good cool season veggie.
PEA SUGAR SNAP	AAS Winner. 70 days. An outstanding edible pod pea. Superb thick pods are crisp, tender and sugary sweet.
PEPPER ALMA PAPRIKA	Heirloom. 70-80 Days. (Sweet) This is a prolific pepper. The plants will be loaded with a bunch of small round peppers change in color from creamy white to orangey red. They are thick walled peppers but have a nice combination of a tangy and sweet flavor. Can be used fresh or as a powder.
PEPPER ANAHEIM	Hybrid. 75 Days. (Mildly Hot) Also known as the New Mexican Chile, this moderately pungent fruit is deep green but turns red at full maturity. These are very smooth peppers which are 7 1/2 inches long and 2 inches wide and are borne on tall productive plants. Excellent used fresh, dried or frozen. Mildly Hot.
PEPPER ANCHO aka POBLANO	75 Days. Mild; 4 to 6 inches long by 2.5 to 3 inches wide; Ancho/Poblano Type; matures from green to red; called "poblano" when fresh, "ancho" when dried; from Mexico; Uses: Large Stuffing, Mexican Cuisine, Mole, Powder, Roasting, Tall Variety; <i>C. annuum</i> .
PEPPER BETTER BELLE	An even blockier, thicker walled and earlier selection than the original. This vigorous variety will give you large, four lobed sweet peppers which mature from green to a bright red over a long growing season.
PEPPER BLACK HUNGARIAN	Highly ornamental and useful in the kitchen. Green foliage is highlighted by purple veins and beautiful purple flowers. Sturdy plants grow to 30 - 36 inches in height. Produces 3 - 4 inch fruits similar in shape to Jalapenos, but black ripening to red. Mildly hot with good flavor.
PEPPER BULGARIAN CARROT	Heirloom. 70-80 Days. (Hot) Colorful 1.5"-3.5" orange fruits with thin skins. Provides heat with a touch of fruit. Fruit grows in clusters on an upright plant. Full sun, with ample water.
PEPPER CARIBBEAN RED HOT	Twice as hot as a regular Habanero. You can also use this pepper green. Be adventurous.
PEPPER CAYENNE LONG THIN	Pencil shaped fruits, often curled and twisted. Red Hot Flavor, dries well. Mature fruit in 75 days.
PEPPER CHERVENA CHUSHKA	Heirloom. 85 Days. (Sweet) Incredibly sweet, used fresh and roasted. Tapered fruit that gets 6 inches long. This pepper an heirloom from Bulgaria, performs well in cooler climates. Ripens from green, to brown, to red.
PEPPER CHILE D'ARBO	A Cayenne type pepper with pointed pods that are 2 to 3 inches long and 3/8 inches wide. They mature to a dark red and are thin fleshed. The Mexican common name is pico de pajaro (bird's beak) and cola de rata (rat's tail). They are usually ground into a dry powder for red chile sauces or added whole to soups and stews.
PEPPER CHILENO SIERRA NEVADA	65 Days. Wax Pepper. These peppers are usually used for pickling with garlic and oregano. Usually mild to medium in heat. aka "Italian Wax Pepper" and "Chileno Pepper".
PEPPER CUBANELLE	Considered an Anaheim Pepper substitute. Great for stuffing, roasting, salads, etc. Mild to moderately warm flavor.
PEPPER FRESNO CHILE	The California pepper for salsa. A medium sized pepper that is 2 - 3 inches in length and about 1 inch wide. These peppers start green, turn orange and then mature to red. A prolific plant that produces over a long summer season.
PEPPER GOLDEN WONDER	The best stuffing and most popular yellow bell pepper ever. Smooth and glossy fruit are large sized, 4 inches by 3 1/2 inches with that classic blocky shape They ripen to a beautiful golden yellow. A wonderful addition to your sweet pepper collection.
PEPPER GOLDEN TREASURE	Heirloom. 80 Days. (Sweet) This Italian heirloom pepper is long and tapered to 8"-9". Thick flesh and thin skins makes it a fabulous pepper for stuffing or roasting. Matures to a glossy golden yellow.
PEPPER HABANERO	This is one of the most intensely hot chile peppers. Unripe fruits are green and they color as they mature. Typically a ripe habanero is 1-2 1/2 inches long.

PEPPER MINIATURE YELLOW BELL	Sweet; 1.5 to 2 inches long by 1 to 1.5 inches wide; Bell Type; matures from green to yellow; pendant pods; from USA; Uses: Small Stuffing; <i>C. annuum</i> . Crisp sweet taste. Peppers do best in well drained warm locations.
PEPPER MULATO ISLENO	Ancho type pepper that turns a warm chocolate brown at maturity. Mildly hot distinctive flavor. Grow in warm well drained areas.
PEPPER PEPPERONCINI ITALIAN	This light green medium sized pepper is great for pickling. Best when picked young. Needs well drained soil. Plant in sunny locations.
PEPPER PIMENTO	Large heart shaped fruit. Often canned and pickled. Mild sweet flavor. 95-100 days.
PEPPER POBLANO aka ANCHO	The most popular pepper in Mexican cooking. Great smoky mild taste. When fresh it is called Poblano, and dried it is called Ancho pepper.
PEPPER PURPLE BEAUTY	A modern exotic that is found on shelves in gourmet sections of vegetable specialty markets. It is a sweet bell pepper with a beautiful deep purple color that can be easily grown alongside of your red and green bells to give you a beautiful rainbow of peppers. The fruit have thick walls which make them perfect for slicing. It makes a compact plant in the garden.
PEPPER RED BELL	Plant this beautiful red bell pepper for it's sweet flavor and incredible color. Fruit will start green and mature to a rich red. These peppers can be used fresh, roasted or baked. Sweet peppers are always a welcome addition to any meal.

PUMPKIN SMALL SUGAR	110 Days. A small 7-8 pound pumpkin excellent for baking, due to its firm meat. Very little tough strings throughout. Beautiful rich orange color.
PUMPKIN SPOOKIE	6-10 pound pumpkin with smooth red-orange skin. Sweet yellow/orange flesh. Great for pie making!
PUMPKIN WEE B LITTLE	95 Days. This baseball sized, miniature pumpkin was selected a winner of the All America Selections in 1999. Its fruit is bright orange and about 3-3 1/2" on average, and about 10-12 ounces each. Great for painting on. Approximately 8 plants per plant.

SOYBEANS ENVY "EDAMAME"	Good for short growing season. Plants grow to 2' with a good yield of bright green pods. Ripe when beans are plump in pod. Good for shelling or drying.
SPINACH BLOOMSDALE	Extra early, heavy yielding plants with large glossy leaves. Slow to bolt.
SQUASH ACORN TABLE QUEEN	Heirloom. 58-90 Days. This winter squash is ribbed and heart shaped. Dark green outside and yellow on the inside. Firm and a nutty flesh, makes this winter squash great for baking. Stores for a long time.
SQUASH BUTTERNUT	Heirloom. 80-100 Days. Winter-squash. This creamy butternut squash can be roasted, made into soup, used as a side dish, and canned. Harvested in the fall, this squash can be stored for months. Pumpkin-orange colored flesh. Bred by Bob Young of Waltham, Massachusetts.
SQUASH EIGHT BALL ZUCCHINI	No one will believe you when you tell them this cute little squash is a zucchini. The super dark green round shape makes them look like a little ball. They are best when picked around 3-4" in diameter, and usually ripen in the hot summer months. Plants are very prolific and will be covered in an abundance of high quality squash.
SQUASH ROMANESCO	Italian zucchini. Beautiful dark green cylindrical squash with a tender sweet taste. Best when picked at 6"-7". Plant in full sun.
SQUASH RONDE DE ITALIA	Round Italian heirloom. Jade colored zucchini produce over a long period. Harvest fruit from golf ball to baseball size. Sublime grilled or try them stuffed. Unique in the garden and wonderful in cuisine.
SQUASH SCALLOP BENNING'S GREEN TINT	A tender and tasty 2-3" scallop squash with light green skin. These plants are heavy producers and should be planted in a sunny location.
SQUASH SUMMER CROOKNECK	This squash produces 8-10" bright yellow fruit with curved necks. Great flavor and hardy vigorous plants. Plant in full sun.
SQUASH ZUCCHINI DK. GREEN	A very prolific bearing plant that will give you 10 to 12 inch fruit at maturity or try harvesting when they are only 2 inches long for the most tender Zucchini that you will ever eat - quick steamed baby vegetables can't be beat! Find this new style of squash on your grocery store shelves and at every good restaurant.
SQUASH ZUCCHINI GOLDEN	Bush plant with bright golden cylindrical fruit. Excellent flavor. 55 days to mature.
SQUASH WINTER DELICATA	One of the best winter squashes. Also known as sweet potato squash because the bright yellow flesh has a distinct sweet potato flavor. Very pretty squash with light green to yellow skin and dark green stripes. Squashes are oblong and can get 5-10" long. The skin is thin and edible. These squashes are good baked or steamed.

SQUASH WINTER VEGETABLE SPAGHETTI	Are you a "carb counter". If so this squash is for you! This is a great substitute for pasta. The creamy flesh resembles pasta and tastes great with cheese or sauce. Squashes are pale yellow and cylindrical weighing 2-3 pounds. Very tasty!
STRAWBERRY ALBION	Day Neutral, Everbearing. This day-neutral variety is new from UC Davis, and is expected to replace the Seascape variety commercially, as a result of its great disease resistance. It has a large conical shape, and its flavor is extremely sweet. Best flavor comes in spring harvest.
STRAWBERRY TEMPTATION	Everbearing. Sweetheart or Alpine-type. This Alpine Strawberry has deep red, medium fruits that bear throughout the year. Plants are compact and have very few runners. Excellent for hanging baskets and other containers. Bears fruit the first season. Good for short season climates. Mulch in winter.
SWISS CHARD BRIGHT LIGHTS	1998 All American Winner. A rainbow of stem colors with green to bronze green leaves. Very tender and mild tasting chard.
TATSOI	Asian greens. Dark green spoon shaped leaves form a perfect thick rosette. Do very well in winter gardens, and can stand up to cold winter nights. These greens have subtle and unique taste. Great raw and used in salad greens.
TOMATILLO TOMA VERDE	Bushy spreading plant, easy to grow and prolific. Green fruits are the size of small tomatoes and are encased in a papery husk which splits open when mature. Sweet tangy flavor used in Mexican green salsa and other South Western dishes. 75 days to mature.
TOMATO ABE LINCOLN	Heirloom. 75 Days. Delicious old time flavor with the uniformity and disease resistance of the new hybrids. The male parent is an heirloom with a strong growing habit and the female parent provides you with earlier maturity – just 75 days from transplant. Deep red 7 ounce fruit grow on this small compact plant. Good in a container. Crack resistant. Determinate.
TOMATO SAN DIEGO	Hybrid. 70 Days. A very hardy, disease resistant tomato with flavorful, 5-7 ounce fruit. A favorite in California. Indeterminate.
TOMATO SAN MARZANO	Heirloom. 80 Days. Another favorite paste tomato with Italian heritage. Small deep red fruit have good flavor. Good for fresh eating and cooking up into your favorite sauce. Indeterminate
TOMATO SIBERIAN	Heirloom. 62 Days. This Russian heirloom is a very early tomato. Sets fruit in cool weather. Medium sized bright red tomatoes with good flavor. Popular for fall planting. Determinate
TOMATO SOLDACKI	Heirloom. 75-80 Days. This large pink tomato grows in high numbers on a potato leafed plant. Its fruit has green shoulders, and a pink-red meat with sweet flavor. The fruit can grow as large as a pound each. Originally from Krakow, Poland, then arriving in Cleveland in 1900. Indeterminate.
TOMATO SPECKLED ROMAN	Heirloom. 85 Days. Red, elongated, 5" Roma- type fruits are striped with yellow, from top to bottom. John Swenson crossed 'Antique Roman' and 'Banana Legs' to get this bicolored beauty. Great for paste, sauces, canning and Ketchup. Indeterminate.
TOMATO STUPICE	Heirloom. 52 Days. A great tomato ! The ABSOLUTE very best tasting early heirloom variety. This tomato from Czechoslovakia has big flavor, is sweet and tangy and all in a 3 to 4 ounce red, round fruit. Very early with an abundant yield from this small plant. Bears well in hot weather and cold. Indeterminate
TOMATO SUN GOLD	Hybrid. 57 Days. This cherry tomato ripens to a golden orange. Very sweet fruit, it produces in warm or cool conditions. Indeterminate
TOMATO SUPERSTEAK	Hybrid. 80 Days. Excellent producer of huge red tomatoes. Usually will get 1-2lbs meaty and delicious fruit. A vigorous plant in full sun. Indeterminate
TOMATO SWEET 100	Hybrid. 65 days. Huge clusters of 1 inch cherry tomatoes. Mouth watering very sweet flavor high in vitamin C. Vigorous vines bear abundantly all season. Indeterminate.
TOMATO SWEET BABY GIRL	Heirloom. 65 Days. One of the best cherry tomatoes on the market, this hybrid cherry rarely cracks, produces 1-2 pounds a week for an extended growing season. Its an early tomato with intense sweetness. Fruits are 1/4 -1 ounce in size. The plant is manageable in size and disease resistant too. Indeterminate.
TOMATO SWEET MILLION	Hybrid. 75 Days. Absolutely wonderful flavor with incredible yield. These super sweet cherry tomatoes start producing early and keep on until frost. Long clusters of 1 - 1 1/2 " fruits will keep your kids happy in the garden. Indeterminate.
TOMATO SWEET OLIVE (GRAPE)	Heirloom. 57 Days. Sweet, bite sized red fruit. A perfect snack and great in salads. Medium tall plant, productive. Determinate
TOMATO THESSALONIKI	Heirloom. 65-70 Days. This heirloom tomato comes from a Greek island, introduced to the USA in the 1950's, and it has been popular ever since. It's very productive, and it doesn't crack. The large, red fruits are 4" in diameter and weigh about 7 oz. Great tomato flavor. Mildly earthy, slightly acidic flavor ranked high in our taste tests. Indeterminate.
TOMATO TOMMY TOE	Heirloom. 70 Days. This little red, apricot-sized tomato does excellent in the cool weather. Originally from the Ozark Mountains, its flavor is sweet and produces extremely high yields. Rates very high in tomato taste tests. Good disease resistance. Indeterminate.
TOMATO WATERMELON BEEFSTEAK	Heirloom. 75 Days. This beautiful pinkish-red skinned beefsteak tomato has fruit that matures to 1-2 pounds. One of the oldest heirlooms, it was introduced by seedsman George Gleckner in 1958 from West Virginia. Indeterminate.
TOMATO YELLOW PEAR	Heirloom. 85 Days. An enormous number of yellow, bite sized, baby pear shaped fruits from this extremely old variety on vigorous plants ! The flavor is deliciously tangy and makes a perfect addition to your summer party trays. Indeterminate
TOMATO YELLOW PERFECTION	Heirloom. 75 Days. This potato leaf heirloom originally from an old British seed company produces 1 1/2 to 2-inch, round, brilliant-yellow, thin-skinned and delicious fruits. And they are . . .Perfect! Indeterminate
TOMATO YELLOW PLUM	Heirloom. 70 Days. Very productive sturdy plants that produce bright yellow small plum shaped tomatoes. Taste sweet and mild. Indeterminate.

WATERMELON GOLDEN MIDGET	Heirloom. 70 Days. This early season melon is a cross between 'New Hampshire Midget' and 'Pumpkin Rind' melons. Bred and introduced by Elwyn Meader and Albert Yeager in 1959. 'Golden Midget' has an oval shaped gold fruit and a pink/coral flesh w/ black seeds.
WATERMELON KLONDIKE BLUE RIBBON STRIPED	Heirloom. 85 Days. Scarlet red flesh and thin rind. Very sweet. Average size of melons is 20-30 lbs. Watermelons like rich well composted soil.
WATERMELON MOUNTAIN SWEET YELLOW	Heirloom. 95-100 Days. This is a beautiful large watermelon with dark green skin and light green stripes and can grow up to 35 pounds. When it is cut the bright yellow flesh is a nice surprise. With a very high sugar content the flesh is super sweet and yummy. Easy to grow and does best in warmer weather.
WATERMELON SUGAR BABY	85 Days. Early variety. Small round melons 8-12 lbs. Fine texture and very sweet. Plant in full sun. Prefers rich soil.
WATERMELON TENDERSWEET ORANGE	90 Days. Oblong melons 30-40 lbs. Medium thick rind with bright orange flesh. High sugar content and very sweet. Plant in rich well composted soil.
